STEM AT ST BERNADETTE'S

As you may be aware, Kim Nguyen has returned to St Bernadette's from maternity leave this year and taken on the role as the STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics) Specialist Teacher. She has replaced Chris Roboerts who was running the Robotics Program. This year we have decided to move from a Robotics Program to a STEM Program. All students from Year 1 to Year 6 will receive one hour STEM class for three terms of the year.

We have decided to move from Robotics to a STEM program, as STEM encompasses a wide range of skills and content areas in an engaging way. STEM nurtures children's natural curiosity by allowing students to create hands-on projects that involve science, technology, engineering, and math. It helps develop critical thinking, problem-solving, teamwork skills, fosters creativity, and prepares students for future careers in a technology-driven world. It also promotes digital literacy, and builds confidence in innovation. Students for this Specialist area will be assessed against the Technologies (Digital Technologies & Design and Technologies) Victorian Curriculum at the end of the year.

SCHOOL SAVING BONUS
