Social and Emotional Learning

English



The students will:

- view and discuss a range of texts about immigration
- analyse the techniques used by authors in a range of visual texts.

Writing

The students will:

- construct simple, compound and complex sentences
- use coordinating conjunctions to join two sentences / clauses
- expand sentences by adding details
- explore the concept of show not tell
- write a character analysis
- plan and write a narrative (Year 5 and 6)
- plan and write a persuasive text (Year 5)
- practice joining printed text to develop handwriting fluency.

Speaking and Listening

The students will:

- respond to teacher directions to fully participate in daily reviews and whole class tasks
- express and justify opinions
- participate in and contribute to discussions.

Spelling - Spelling Mastery (30 min sessions, 3 sessions per week) The students will be in differentiated spelling groups which will focus on:

- phonics sounds that the letters make
- morphology prefixes, suffixes and base words
- spelling rules for the irregular spelling of words.

At Home Learning -

Year 5 and 6 students are expected to read for at least 20 minutes a night, five days a week. This needs to be recorded on the Year 5 homework sheets and Year 6 diaries.

Mathematics

Year 5 & 6 - Data

The students will:

 interpret frequency charts to construct a variety of data displays

Year 5 - Number

The students will:

- identify factors and multiples and explain reasoning
- solve equations involving multiplication and division using mental and written strategies.

Year 6 - Number

The students will:

- identify and describe prime and composite numbers
- use BODMAS to evaluate equations in the correct order.



Year 5 - Measurement


The students will:

 solve problems involving the perimeter and area of regular and irregular shapes using metric units

Year 6 - Measurement

The students will:

- measure and compare elapsed time
- interpret timetables and determine the duration of events and journeys
- investigate the formula for the area of a rectangle and use it to solve practical problems










Visual Arts

The students will :

- explore the Art elements of line, shape, colour, and texture through a variety of materials and art-making processes
- make connections between art and the world around them, responding to the ideas of emotion and storytelling in art making
- research the art of Opie (Yr 5), Picasso (Yr 6) and Kusama
- apply the Learning Assets of thinking, researching, communicating and selfmanaging in the art learning space
- respond to art and art making, using digital tools and applications.

The students will:

- visually plan the process of making a product, e.g using a storyboard
- generate a range of design ideas for products using prior knowledge, skills and research
- develop criteria for their own successes when creating design solutions
- choose appropriate materials, tools and techniques for a specific purpose when producing a product.






Physical Education Ian Miller

The students will:

- engage in activities and games that require increased application and execution of movement sequences
- engage in independent and collaborative play with a range of equipment and through participation in games with varying levels of complexity
- consolidate and increase their application and execution of defensive and offensive play when participating in modified sport specific games
- demonstrate a sense of fair play and sportsmanship towards their peers.



Performing Arts - Music Jennifer Marshall

The students will:

- explore the Music elements of Rhythm and Beat in a variety of music
- use digital technology to manipulate and compose rhythms
- practise technical skills and use of expressive elements of music when using percussion instruments
- play their own rhythmic compositions, demonstrating conventional notation.



Italian Matteo Maccio

The students will:

- explore why we learn a second language and the benefits that come from learning a language other than English
- learn about 'Carnevale', its symbols, the most important masks and the ways it is celebrated in the main Italian cities (Venice, Viareggio, Naples)
- research and present their knowledge about Italy, its symbols and landmarks.
