# PARKING ON WESTMORELAND RD - AN ACCIDENT WAITING TO HAPPEN!!!!

Drop off and pick up times on Westmoreland Rd are a real concern at the moment. People are not obeying the road or parking laws. The behaviours that NOT SAFE and most concerning are:

- 1. parents/carers parking in the drop off zone and leaving their cars
- 2. parents/carers making u-turns from the drop off area and close to the school crossing
- 3. parents/carers double parking
- 4. parents/carers not parking correctly back of car still on the road
- 5. children getting in and out of the driver's side of the car

This behaviour MUST stop for the safety of our children and of all drivers. Thank you.



#### **PROJECT COMPASSION THIS LENT**

Toefuata'iga - (Toy-foo-ah-tah-ing-ah) is a 13-year-old primary school student from Samoa. Samoa may be a country surrounded by water, but access to clean drinking water is scarce in some areas, with many families facing extreme hardship as a result.

Toefuata'iga's school community struggled without reliable access to clean water, which impacted students' education and hygiene. Teachers often had to leave the school to fetch water from nearby homes, disrupting lessons and adding strain to the community. When the water ran out at the school. students were sent home which meant they missed out on valuable learning time.

Thanks to the support of Caritas Australia in partnership with Caritas Samoa, Toefuata'iga's school now has a 10,000L water tank through a Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH) program. Teachers and students now have access to clean drinking water at their school and are able to focus on education. "Now that we have the water tank, things are so much better, we can stay at school all day, and I get to spend more time learning and playing with my friends. I'm happy that we don't have to go home early anymore," said Toefuata'iga.

This transformative story is just one example of how Caritas Australia's Project Compassion creates waves of change around the world.

# **GRIP STUDENT LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE - REFLECTION**

On the Tuesday 4th of March 2025, the School Student Leaders and SRCs from Year 5 and 6 went to the GRIP Leadership Conference in the city at the Melbourne Convention and Exhibition Centre. GRIP stands for Generous, Responsibility, Integrity and People. The teachers who attended with us were Ashleigh Cahill (Student Wellbeing Leader) and Eliza Katz (Mental Health and Wellbeing in Primary Schools Leader). The bus ride took about 40 minutes and we arrived at 8:40am.

The reason we went was so we could learn how to be better student leaders and make our school a better place. We communicated together as school leaders and collaborated with different schools. The day was broken up into different sessions, all of them on a different topic about Student Leadership.

Session 3 was Achieving Your Ideas Before the End of the Year.

The day ended with Q & A with the GRIP Leadership Team and a fun Loud Noises session. Loud Noises sessions were similar to Brain Breaks to enable us to refocus and re-energise and lots of students were chosen to volunteer.
